9.1 PUBLIC HEARING - Inland Port

Mayor Fullmer will present a proposal for the creation of one Utah Inland Port Authority project area to allow for public input on (i) whether the requested service (described below) is needed in the area of the Proposed Project Area, (ii) whether the service should be provided by the City or the Proposed Project Area, and (iii) all other matters relating to the Proposed Project Area.

9.2 DISCUSSION AND ACTION - <u>East Geneva Right-of-way and Land Donation and</u> <u>Development Agreement (Resolution 2023-51)</u>

(A Public Hearing was held for this item during the Joint Planning Commission and City Council meeting December 6, 2023.)

Community Development Director will present a request for approval of a right-of-way and land donation and development agreement between Vineyard City, Utah, The Vineyard Redevelopment Agency, and Anderson Geneva, LLC, for the following parcel numbers: 17:019:0047, 38:437:0001, 38:437:0002, 17:022:0006, and 46:870:0004. 9.3 DISCUSSION AND ACTION – <u>First Amendment to Geneva West Side Property</u> <u>Land Donation and Development Agreement (Resolution 2023-55)</u>
